Mission and Service – Helping Children and Communities Grow
Becoming a new parent can be overwhelming, with the constant
demands of caring for a newborn, sleepless nights, and the
pressure to make the right choices for your child. The exhaustion
and balancing daily responsibilities while navigating the unknowns

At Fairview Resource Centre in Halifax, Nova Scotia, the New Parents Support group aims to walk with parents as they navigate the complexities of raising a newborn. Once a week, parents gather to meet with a public health nurse who provides education and answers questions. From expectant parents to those with babies up to 18 months, the program provides resources for those who might not otherwise have access to in-person support or resources.

Parents connect not only with health professionals, but form deep bonds with each other, and some are still in contact many years later. Many of us have heard that "it takes a village to raise a child," and Fairview Resource Centre is truly taking action to give a positive space for children in the community to flourish.
