Fazil Malik is a trained IT professional with extensive experience in the field. He is well-versed in online security measures and digital

safety practices. He has honed his public speaking skills through involvement with Toastmasters and has presented on technical and safety-related topics at various public gatherings. He has delivered talks on online and phone safety at various events, effectively communicating critical strategies for staying secure in the digital age.

The program will run for approximately 45 minutes, starting with a brief welcome and introduction. This will be followed by a general overview of online safety, setting the stage for a more detailed presentation. A slideshow will accompany the talk, highlighting key concepts, such as phishing, scamming, and spoofing, along with practical examples of fraudulent activities. Participants will learn to recognize the warning signs of scams and how to protect themselves. The session will conclude with real-life examples, demonstrations of scam tactics, and an interactive Q&A.

Hunter River Helping Hand Program – In order to ensure that food is distributed in a more equitable and consistent manner, the Hunter River Community Fridge has become the Hunter River Helping Hand Program. This program is a monthly food pick up on the second Monday of each month for residents of Hunter River, Greenvale, Brookfield, Rennies Road, New Glasgow, Wheatley River, Hazel Grove, Fredericton and Darlington that register with the program. Your application will be handled with compassion and confidentiality. In order to be eligible for a food pick up in February, registration must be completed by **tomorrow**, January 27th.

Registration for the program can be done Monday-Thursday between 9am and 2pm at the municipal office located in the Hunter River Community Centre at 19816 Route 2. Proof of residence in the service area for each member of the household will be required at the time of registration. Registered users will need to inform the office by the last Monday of each month if they will be requiring assistance the following month.
